

IPLAN History

- 1992: IPLAN was developed by IDPH in collaboration with LHDs and other system partners to meet requirements set for in the IL Administrative Code, Section 600, Certified Local Health Department Code. IPLAN certification demonstrates a LHDs commitment to providing core public health services.
- 1994: Round 1 - 86 LHDs submitted IPLAN in October 1994
- 1999: Round 2 - 92 LHDs submitted IPLAN in October 1999
- 2004: Code modified to allow staggering of submission dates. (DuPage County selected October 12, 2005 as submission date.)

DuPage County IPLAN History

Round 1 (1994 – 1998) Certification date October 12, 1994

Strategic Issues

1. MCH – Increase proportion of babies receiving primary care
2. Cancer – Reduce breast cancer
3. Youth Violence – Reduce school violence
4. Heart Disease – Reduce coronary heart disease

Round 2 (1999 – 2003) Certification date October 12, 1999

Strategic Issues

1. Untreated Depression – Maintain current rates
2. Domestic Abuse – Reduce domestic violence
3. Cardiovascular Disease – Reduce coronary heart disease
4. Indoor Air Quality – Reduce exposure to inferior air quality for children

Round 3 (2004 – 2008) Certification date October 12, 2005

Process: MAPP

Strategic Issues

1. Overweight and Obesity – Prevent and treat overweight and obesity
2. Mental Health – Develop capacity to meet the mental health needs
3. Access to Care – Assure access to health services for all low-income, uninsured residents

Round 4 (2009 – 2013) Certification date October 12, 2010

Process: MAPP (Impact DuPage)

Strategic Issues

1. Overweight and Obesity – Reduce overweight and obesity
2. Access to Care – Assure access to health services for all low-income residents
3. Mental Health & Substance Abuse – Reduce risk factors and increase protective factors
4. Infectious Diseases – Reduce incidence of infectious diseases

Round 5 (2014 – 2018) Certification date October 12, 2015

Strategic Issues

1. Access to Health Services – Capitalize on changes within the healthcare landscape to support diverse populations
2. Behavioral Health Treatment – Strengthen the mental health treatment system
3. Substance Abuse – Strengthen prevention and treatment of substance abuse issues
4. Healthy Lifestyles – influence residents and partners to make positive choices regarding nutrition, physical activity, and the built environment
5. Affordable Housing – Inspire community action to develop housing that meets the current socioeconomic and demographic profile of the county

Round 6 (2018 – 2021) Plan Submission Due October 2020

Strategic Issues

1. Affordable Housing – Develop housing that meets the demographic profile of the county
2. Behavioral Health – Strengthen prevention and treatment of behavioral health issues
3. Health Status Improvement – Build a person-centered model of healthcare
