Adult Behavioral Health Services

The goal is to preserve and promote the well-being of DuPage County residents who have mental illness or who are mentally ill and abusing substances.

All Kids (Health Insurance for Illinois Children)

Assistance in completing and submitting the application for All Kids insurance.

APORS

The purpose of the Adverse Pregnancy Outcomes Reporting System (APORS) purpose is to conduct surveillance on birth defects, to guide public health policy in the reduction of adverse pregnancy outcomes, and to identify and refer children who require special services to correct and prevent developmental problems and other disabling conditions.

Better Birth Outcomes (Great Start)

Provides prenatal health education, linkage to and coordination of care with primary and specialty medical care and other social services, referrals to childbirth education and parenting classes, to pregnant women with risk factors that lead to poor birth outcomes.

Birth Certificates

Certified copies of birth certificates for persons born in DuPage County are available for a fee.

Child and Adolescent Behavioral Health Services

The goal of the Child and Adolescent Program is to strengthen the functioning of families by assisting a child or adolescent with emotional problems.

Childcare Environmental Health Program

Monitors health and safety in childcare centers and group homes and responds to public complaints.

Communicable Disease Control and Prevention

Surveillance and investigation of communicable diseases.

Community Environmental Health Program

Investigate complaints of health hazards and general nuisances in the community.

Crisis Hotline (630) 627-1700

The Crisis Unit deals with mental health emergencies for adults, children and adolescents on a 24-hour basis, 365 days a year. The Unit provides services to residents with urgent behavioral health issues such as suicidal thoughts, homicidal threats and symptoms of serious mental illnesses that require immediate intervention.

Death Certificates

Certified copies of death certificates for deaths in DuPage County are available for a fee.

Dental Health Program

Provides referrals to dentists; oral health education, preventative services and dental sealants for children in elementary schools; services for children on the mobile "Smile Squad" dental clinic; urgent care and low cost treatment options.

Environmental Health Services Education

Community health promotion and education involving environmental health issues.

Family Case Management

Supports pregnant women and infants with referrals for prenatal care, health education, nutrition and community services.

Food Protection Program

Monitors food protection and sanitary conditions in DuPage County food establishments. Regulates the construction and remodeling for food facilities including temporary food and mobile vendors. Responds to public complaints regarding food establishments.

Forensic Behavioral Health

Provides assessment & treatment for those who have mental health and/or substance use treatment needs, who are also involved in the criminal justice system.



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Health Promotions

Provides free health education programs for Public and private schools, Neighborhood Resource Centers and other specialty groups in the community. Health Promotions also provides Health Department materials for health fairs.

Health Works of Illinois

Assists foster parents in finding medical services for their foster children.

Healthy Families

Supports positive parenting by building upon family strengths. Home visits are available.

Immunizations

Provides childhood and adult immunizations for a fee.

Private Water Supply and Sewage Disposal

Regulates the construction, installation, repair and the proper use of private water supplies and sewage disposal systems (septic systems).

Pools, Spas, Tanning, Body Art

Regulates the operation of spas, tanning facilities and body art facilities.

Refugee Health Screenings

Health screenings and vaccinations for new refugees arriving through World Relief DuPage.

Sexually Transmitted Disease Services

Education, testing, diagnosis, counseling, treatment and focused physical exams are provided.

School Health Services

Consultation available to public and private schools, including childcare centers and colleges.

Tobacco Prevention and Control

Linkage to services and training on issues of tobacco prevention control and cessation.

Tuberculosis Services

TB skin testing, diagnosis and treatment.

Vision and Hearing Screening

For children 3 – 18 years of age in the school setting.

Water Testing

Environmental laboratory for testing water.

West Nile virus

Traps and tests mosquitos and provides dead bird monitoring for West Nile virus. Results reported on website.

Women, Infants and Children (WIC) Services

Provides nutritional counseling, education and food vouchers to eligible women and children.

Women's Health Services

Breast cancer screenings. Cardiovascular screening for eligible women.
