Schedule Changes for DuPage County’s COVID-19 Testing Sites

DuPage County—The operation schedules for the DuPage County COVID-19 Testing Sites in Wheaton and Villa Park will be modified to support COVID-19 vaccine distribution efforts and observe the upcoming holidays. The drive-thru COVID-19 testing site in Wheaton will be closed beginning Thursday, December 24 through January 3, 2020. The DuPage County COVID-19 Testing Site in Villa Park will remain open with changes in hours of operation.

Visitors are encouraged to pre-register at testdirectly.com, but pre-registration does not guarantee testing or a place in line for that day.
